RESOLUTION OF THE CITY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF WILDWOOD APPROVING A FOURTH ROUND AFFORDABLE HOUSING TRUST FUND SPENDING PLAN AND REQUESTING PROGRAM AND COURT APPROVAL OF THE SPENDING PLAN

WHEREAS, the City of Wildwood (hereinafter "City" or "Wildwood") has an approved Development Fee Ordinance, which established standards for the collection, maintenance, and expenditure of development fees; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2024, Governor Murphy signed into law P.L. 2024, c.2, which amended the 1985 New Jersey Fair Housing Act (hereinafter the "Amended FHA") which governs how municipalities will comply with their affordable housing obligations for the Fourth Round (2025-2035); and

WHEREAS, the City has prepared a Fourth Round Spending Plan consistent with the Amended FHA and other applicable regulations, which projects anticipated revenues to the City's Affordable Housing Trust Fund and describes the anticipated expenditures of funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Wildwood, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Board of Commissioners of the City of Wildwood hereby approves the Fourth Round Spending Plan that is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and requests that the Program and the Court review and approve the City's Fourth Round Spending Plan.
- City of Wildwood shall promptly submit the Fourth Round Spending Plan to the Program and Court for its approval.
- 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption, according to law.
